SPECIAL RULES:

1. Fair cases are limited.

- No cases will be assigned until after Wednesday May 1st. All exhibitors will be called or e- mailed after Wednesday. May 1st.
- 3. Please describe collection upon entering.
- Exhibit may be displayed only 1 year unless varied in some significant way. Entries accepted on spaceavailable basis and to balance the show.
- 5. At least **12 items** are required for a hobby case entry.
- 6. The Fair will provide the Hobby cases and will lock each case with fair-provided lock.
- 7. Please neatly label items with name and something interesting and appropriate (age, source, etc.)
 Labels should be neat, easy to read, and correct.
 Using 14-16 point fonts depending on style makes labels easily readable. Tell the public something interesting about your hobby: why you collect or make it, what is unique, where to find more information, how you make it, etc. Encourage the public to study your case. Judges shall show preference for those displays that are most educational.
- 8. It is your responsibility to take out any staples and tape put in the case on tear down day.
- 9. Each exhibitor is limited to one cash award per class. Judges will make no award if not worthy.
- 10. Your name should not appear in case. After judging, fair staff will attach an exhibit tag with your name.
- 11. Please do not place anything on the outside of the cases. No extra electricity inside or out. You may choose to supply battery powered additions.
- 12. If you have a conflict with the time scheduled to set up your display, please contact (925) 426-5138 or (925) 426-7611 so that we can work out an alternative time. If for any reason, you will be unable to bring your collection, please contact us so we can contact a replacement from the waiting list.

- 2. Also see Jewelry Category for other places to enter handmade necklaces etc.
- 3. Exhibitor must own entries.
- 4. All lapidary work must be done by the exhibitor.
- 5. Exhibit may be displayed only 1 year unless varied in some significant way.
- 6. Open to Amateurs only.

SPECIAL RULES:

- 1. BEADS: Composition of piece must contain a minimum of 50% beads in the overall design.
- 2. Entry to be 80% constructed and/or assembled by the Exhibitor.
- 3. To qualify for any award, labeling must include: type(s) of material(s), hours to assemble, name for the piece, elements made by exhibitor, and state if bead made by exhibitor.
- 4. The same exhibitor may not win a special award two years in a row.
- 5. A Professional is any bead maker who has sold work.

SPECIAL RULES:

- Exhibitor must complete the project within 1 year of the Fair.
- 2. At time of entry, please include title or subject & type of wood.
- 3. Woodcarvings need to be less than 3-1/2 feet long and less than 50 pounds.
- 4. Exhibitors will carry their own woodcarving into the Hobby Building.
- 5. See also Jewelry Division and Fine Art Department for other places to enter.
- 6. Date must be carved, engraved, or otherwise visible on each carving entry.
- Novice: Any Carvers who have not won any blue ribbons.

Open: Any Carver who has won one of the following awards (blue ribbon, BOS, Judges Choice, or Show Chairman's Choice
