Live Horse Racing Continues in Pleasanton for the 162nd Year This Summer

Prize Money, Stakes Races, and Online Betting

Pleasanton, Calif. – Live Horse Racing returns to the track in Pleasanton every Friday through Sunday through July 26, first post is at 2:45pm each racing day. Total prize money over six weeks of racing is \$2.3 million with five stakes races totaling \$200,000 in prize money.

The Current Alameda County Health Order does not allow spectators at the race track, but online betting is available through the following websites or by downloading their apps to your smartphone: DRF Bets, Xpressbet, and TVG.

Outdoor Patio Dining at the Trackside Terrace is available for dining; guests must pre-order meals to reserve a table with a maximum group of six per table. Options for wagering are available through apps for mobile devices at the track. Face masks are required when guests are not eating or drinking and tables are set 6 feet apart to ensure physical distance requirements. For the health and safety of our racing community, any guests admitted at the Trackside Terrace will have to answer questions regarding their health and have their temperature taken with a touch-less thermometer.
