Adult Still Exhibits Department Rules

Submission of entry constitutes agreement to these rules.

1. Eligibility:

- The competition is for adult residents of California.
- b. Professional exhibitors must enter the Professional categories. A Professional is someone who has: 1) sold more than half of the items made in any year within the entry category, 2) who has taught classes for payment, or 3) is employed in the industry. Professionals receive ribbons, but do not qualify for premiums.
- c. Senior categories are optional categories for exhibitors ages 62 years and older. Exhibitors may not enter as both a senior and a non-senior in the same entry category.
- d. With submission of entry registration, the exhibitor confirms their ability to deliver entry to the fair on the posted delivery date(s) and time(s). Entry fees will not be refunded. Late entries will not be accepted.

2. Entries:

- a. Entry Limit: 2 per class per exhibitor (unless otherwise specified).
- b. Exhibitors must prepare non-food entries within one year of the opening date of the Fair.
- c. The Fair will provide an exhibit tag using the information provided upon registration.
- d. Exhibit tags will be printed as entered. Any changes to the entry title or category must be emailed prior to the posted registration deadline. Once the deadline has passed, no changes may be made to the title or category entered and the entry will be judged as entered.
- e. On occasion, entries may be transferred to a different division or class by judges or fair staff. This may result in the exhibitor exceeding class limits, which may affect award eligibility.
- f. Division and Class: An entry eligible in more than one Division and/or Class should be entered in the Division and/or Class for which it best qualifies. The Alameda County Fair or judges may disqualify or transfer entries to the correct category (at their discretion). It is not, however, the responsibility of the Alameda County Fair or a judge to transfer an entry to the correct class or division.

3. How to Enter:

- a. Review the Adult Still Exhibits Department and any division specific rules.
- b. Go to: https://alamed.fairwire.com/ and Register/Log-In.
- c. Select the "Create Entries" option.
- d. Choose the Department/Division/Class for each entry.
- e. Enter the title (and description, if desired).
- f. Complete payment of entry fees. (Entries are not accepted prior to payment of entry fees.)
- g. Entry Confirmation: Upon receipt of entry fees, an email confirmation will be sent. This will be your receipt for the entry fee.
- 4. Display, Handling, Presentation, & Release of Entries:
 - a. The Fair Association reserves the right to refuse any entry or refuse to display any entry considered not to be in the best interest of the Fair. No entry will be accepted where an exhibitor prescribes conditions under which they will exhibit. Once submitted, all exhibits are under the direct control of the Fair Association and cannot be removed until the specified release day.
 - b. Greatest care will be exercised in handling exhibits, but the Fair Management, Alameda County Fair Association, and the County of Alameda will not be held liable for loss, theft, or damage of any kind from any cause.
 - c. While entries will be secure, most items will not be displayed behind glass or in cases.
 - d. Please be aware of all requirements including size, weight, and mounting instructions. Items that do not adhere to those requirements will not be selected for physical display.
 - e. <u>Upon submitting an entry for physical display at the Fair, the exhibitor agrees to pick up the entry after the fair on the posted release date. Failure to pick up the entry may affect selection for display at future Alameda County Fairs.</u>
 - f. Any unclaimed entries or ribbons will be held at the Exhibits Office until Labor Day. After that point, they will be discarded.

5. Judging & Awards:

- a. Entries are judged using the American System of Judging where exhibits are judged against each other. There is the availability of one 1st, 2nd, 3rd place. Honorable Mention may be awarded at the discretion of the judge(s). All 1st place winners in a division will compete against each other for the Best of Show. Judges may choose to omit any placing that is believed to be without merit.
- b. Qualified judges are selected by the Alameda County Fair. Judging decisions are final.



- c. Sponsored Awards:
 - i. Sponsored awards will be awarded from eligible entries selected for physical display and delivered to the Fair. Each entry may only win one sponsored award.
 - The Fair does not guarantee the payment of Sponsored special premiums and awards as they are secured in good faith.
- d. Sweepstakes are offered in Baked Food, Hand Crafts, Preserved Food, Textiles, & Sewing and are calculated based on total points (1st: 5 pts, 2nd: 3 pts, 3rd": 1 pt.) earned for eligible entries.
 - i. Ties will be broken by the number of Best of Show or 1st place entries.
 - ii. 1st Place: \$30, 2nd Place: \$25, 3rd Place: \$20, 4th Place: \$15, 5th Place: \$10
- e. Premium awards are mailed in mid-July.

<u>Culinary Arts Rules</u>
Submission of entry constitutes agreement to these rules (& Adult Stills Department Rules).

1. Entries:

- a. If allowed, and entering more than one recipe per class, the recipes must be different. Within any year, each recipe may only be entered once.
- Food entries do not need to be baked or preserved from an original recipe (unless otherwise specified), but must be handmade by the entrant from scratch and must not use any prepared mixes (with the exception of Tricks with a Mix).
- All baked foods must be entered with a complete recipe at time of delivery. Recipes will not be shared and will be returned with the judge's comment card.
- Enter: 1 whole loaf, cake, pie; 7 cupcakes, cookies, candies, muffins, pastries, rolls, etc. Multiple items should not be individually wrapped. Only a portion of the entry may be displayed.
- Refrigeration is not guaranteed and will not be provided after judging has concluded.
- Presentation & Display:
 - a. All Period 1 baked food items will be discarded prior to Period 2 delivery. Items may be discarded prior to that time if they become deteriorated; this is at the discretion of fair personnel. Results will be available via QR code posted in the building.
 - b. With the exception of pies which should be entered in a glass pie plate, baked food entries should be delivered in non-returnable, disposable containers, plates or wraps.
 - Baked goods will be displayed on plates provided by the fair. Unless otherwise specified, plate presentation has no effect on judging results.
- Judging & Awards:
 - a. Judging Standards:
 - i. Breads: 10% Appearance, 30% Flavor, 25% Texture, 15% Crumb, 10% Crust, 10% Recipe
 - ii. Decorated Food: 30% Appearance, 25% Icing, 25% Uniformity in Decorating, 10% Originality/Creativity, 10% Difficulty Factor.
 - iii. Pies/Pastries: 20% Appearance, 30% Crust, 40% Filling, 10% Recipe
 - iv. Guittard Chocolate Contest: 20% Appearance, 30% Texture, 40% Taste, 10% Creativity
 - v. King Arthur Flour Baking Company: 25% Appearance/Creativity, 25% Texture, 50% Taste
 - vi. All Other Categories: 20% Appearance, 25% Texture, 45% Flavor, 10% Recipe.
 - b. Ribbons, judge's comment cards, and recipes for table settings, baked, decorated, and preserved foods will be available for pick up during Fair hours beginning Sunday, June 30. Any desired ribbons, comment cards or recipes not picked up during the fair must be picked up on the exhibit release day. Ribbons, comment cards, and recipes will not be mailed. Unclaimed ribbons, comment cards and recipes will be held at the Exhibit Office until Labor Day. At that point, they will be discarded.
 - Cash Awards Per Class (unless otherwise noted): 1st Place: \$10, 2nd Place: \$8, 3rd Place: \$6

- 1. All entries must be submitted in a standard canning jar with new screw bands (no paraffin seals).
- 2. Exhibitors must attach a label to the bottom of the jar with the product name, date prepared, preservation method, and any unusual ingredients.
- 3. All jars must be properly sealed. Unsealed jars and jars that are unable to be opened by the judges will be disqualified and may not be displayed.
- 4. Please have proper headspace. Judges use the guidelines posted in the most recent version of the Ball Blue Book.
- 5. Vinegars & Liqueurs should be entered in a glass bottle or decanter.
- 6. Dried foods may be entered in any clear self-sealing bag or container.
- 7. Entries in the "Any Other" classes may only be entered if there is no class listed for that category.
- 8. For example, soft spreads spiced or enhanced may only be entered in those specific classes.
- 9. Judging Standards:
 - a. Dried: 10% Container, 40% Flavor & Aroma, 25% Uniform Color, 25% Texture
 - b. Fruits & Vegetables: 10% Container, 20% Pack, 60% Product, 10% Proper Headspace
 - c. Soft Spreads: 10% Container, 15% Appearance, 25% Texture, 40% Flavor, 10% Proper Headspace.
 - d. Vinegars & Liqueurs: 25% Appearance, 45% Flavor & Aroma, 15% Aftertaste, 15% Overall Impression.

Fiber Arts Rules

Submission of entry constitutes agreement to these rules (& Adult Stills Department Rules).

- 1. Entries must be clean, neat, and ready for display.
- 2. Items that are soiled or showing wear will not be accepted, judged, or displayed.
- 3. All quilts and wall hangings must have a 4" sleeve to accommodate a cross pole for hanging. (Sleeve must be continuous across the width of the piece. Fold a 9" strip of fabric in half and sew with a ½" seam, making a long tube. Place seam against the back of the piece and baste or blind stitch the sleeve in place 1" below the top and ½" from each side, taking care not to sew through the front.)
- Judging Standards:
 - a. Crochet & Knit: 25% Appearance, 50% Workmanship, 25% Suitability
 - b. Lace & Tatting: 20% Appearance, 70% Workmanship & Technical Skills, 10% Difficulty Factor

 - c. Needlework & Embroidery: 30% Appearance, 50% Workmanship, 20% Suitability
 d. Quilting: 50% Art, 50% Construction
 e. Rugs/Spinning/Weaving: 30% Appearance, 40% Workmanship, 20% Suitability, 10% Creativity
 - f. Sewing: 40% Appearance, 60% Workmanship

Quilts larger than the display area may need to be pinned. Quilts without sleeves will not be hung.

In cases where someone other than the exhibitor completed the quilting,
please specify the quilter's name upon entry registration.

All Quilting entries must have images uploaded to qualify for awards. Images to upload: Whole front, whole back, close up of one block/18" x 18" area. Refunds will not be issued for failure to upload images.

After payment, select **UPLOAD MEDIA** and follow the prompts to upload the digital image files that correspond with the Title/Description. If you have multiple entries, please carefully look at the Title/Description in the top right-hand corner when uploading the digital images to ensure the images match the entry.

- 7. Weight limit: 25 pounds. Maximum size: 24" x 36" without prior approval.

- 9. Judging Standards:
